WORLD FIRST - COMMUNITY GEOGRAPHIC DOMAIN NAMES (CGDN)

8 new second level domains in the .au space for each state and territory:

> vic.au; nsw.au; qld.au; tas.au; nt.au; wa.au; sa.au; act.au

To be registered as 3rd level Domains in simple form of town/suburb.state/territory.au

eg. katherine.nt.au



WHY CGDNs?

- Australia has over 27,000 communities spread across a large area
- Many of these are geographically isolated far from major centres and services
- The growing use of the World Wide Web offers the means for communities to communicate and work together
- May lead to virtual addressing



AIM

- Provide an intuitive, standardised naming system
- Preserve Australian geographic names for use by the relevant community
- Enable better access to local community, tourism and business information
- Facilitate social and economic benefits to **Australian Communities**
