• The Brundtland commission (The World Commission on Environment and Development (WCED)) named after its chairperson, Former Norwegian prime minister, Mrs. Gro Harlem Brundtland defined the concept of sustainable development more precisely as development that meets the need of the present without compromising the ability of the future generations to meet their own needs (WCED, 1987).

• The publication paved way for the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development (UNCED) held at Rio de Janeiro in 1992 and seconded by the Habitat Conference at Istanbul, 1996, which also emphasized on the need for sound environmental management




NEED FOR A SUSTAINABLE ENVIRONMENT

CHALLENGES TO WOMEN CONTRIBUTIONS

- SOME OF THE CHALLENGES ARE:
- POLICY BIASES-Women represent over 50% of population of Nigeria, however, only about 2% are involved in policy initiation.
- SOCIO-CULTURAL BIASES-THIS LEADS TO CONTINUED SUBORDINATUION OF WOMEN'S ECONOMIC GOALS.
- PLACEMENT IN FEMALE GHETTOS.-WOMEN ARE JUST PLACED ON FLEXIBLE JOBS-NOT WHAT THEY NEED BUT WHAT THEY SHOULD DO.

CHALLENGES CONTD.

- LACK OF EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES AND SKILLS DEVELOPMENT-According to UNESCO in 2006, the share of women in scientific tertiary studies was only 29% and 16% in the field of engineering.
- POVERTY AND FINANCIAL CONSTRAINTS: This the bane of female education and empowerment in Nigeria.

RECOMMENDATIONS AND CONCLUSION

- ADVOCACY FOR BETTER TRAINING OF THE FEMALE FOLK.
- CULTURAL, SOCIAL AND RELIGIOUS BARRIERS TO WOMEN TRAINING SHOLD BE JETTISONED.
- MALE CHAUVINISM MUST BE FORGOTTEN AND WOMEN NEED TO BE ALLOWED TO HAVE EQUAL PLAYING CONDITIONS
- CARE AND CONSTRUCTIVE PLAN SHOULD BE PUT IN PLACE TO TRAIN GIRLS FROM LESS PRIVILEDGED HOMES.
