- Mixed land uses
- Extensive uses playgrounds, parks/ nature reserves, institutional training college, home gardens/ orchards
- Noisy and annoying uses prisons, mental hospitals, airports, quarries/ mines, sewage works, cemeteries
- Shifting boundaries
- Fastest population growth informal settlements
- Greatest amount of land use changes
- Chaotic development
- Vast income differentials among new settlers: rich vs. poor
- Gated communities


